#### <u>Millbrook Tobacco</u> <u>Store</u>

### **Cheque Cashing – effective** immediately

As per the direction of Millbrook Band Chief and Council on September 11, 2018:

- -Millbrook Tobacco Store will be permitted to cash only the following cheques:
  - Millbrook Social payments
- -Cheques can only be cashed by the Millbrook Band member that it is written out to. No third party cheque cashing is authorized.
- -Appropriate identification will be required.

## Tobacco Quota Limits – effective immediately

As per direction of Millbrook Band Chief and Council on September 11, 2018:

-As in compliance with Nova Scotia Retail Vendor Permit regulations, purchase transactions cannot exceed a total of 1,000 grams of product (cigarettes and tobacco combined)

note that 1 carton of cigarettes = 200 grams (5 cartons equal a maximum purchase)

-Millbrook Band Member monthly cigarette carton limit amount is 5 cartons -Millbrook Band Member previous monthly loose tobacco limit of 600 grams has been eliminated. No purchases greater than 1,000 grams a day will be permitted.

-Any Millbrook Band Member, that has used the 5 cigarette carton limit, can only purchase 1 package of cigarettes, on any business day of Millbrook Tobacco Store, until the end of that month.

Our Learning Centre hosted a series of "Bring Your Lunch and Learn" sessions during the month of October. Sessions included Mi'kmaq language, crafts, dancing and storytelling. Thank you to Patsy Paul-Martin, CCRCE's Facilitator of First Nations and Melody Googoo, CCRCE's Coordinator of Mi'kmaq Education/Services for presenting at some of our sessions. I will be filling in as the Millbrook First Nations Student Support Worker at TJHS until February.

I started here towards the end of September, but I already felt a sense of belonging to the community of TJHS.

On September 27<sup>th</sup>, we wore orange shirts to remember that "Every Child Matters". This is a day that we all honour and show our support to those affected by the Indian Residential Schools.

October 1<sup>st</sup> we celebrated Treaty Day and this day also marks the start of Mi'kmaq History Month. We had a school wide assembly that highlighted our culture and heritage. We collaborated together with the help from Patsy Paul-Martin and Melody Martin Googoo, and we thought what is best way to utilize our First Nations Learning Centre than to host a "Mi'kmaw Bring your Lunch and Learn" for the month of October.

The Grade 6's had a trip to the Shubenacadie Wildlife Park to explore the park and learn about the bio-diversity of animals in the wetlands.

The Grade 6's wrote their Provincial reading, writing, and math assessments. This gave each student an opportunity to showcase their understanding and the results will be available in the new year.

#### MILLBROOK SCHOOL BUS SAFETY RULES

All students have the right to feel safe while on Millbrook buses. Any student who is proven to be bullying another student on any Millbrook buses will be suspended from all Millbrook buses.

The following suspensions are for both Verbal Bullying and Physical Bullying.

1st Offence – suspended from buses for a period of 5 school days;

2nd Offence – suspended from buses for a period of 1 full month;

3<sup>rd</sup> Offence – suspended from buses for remainder of school year.

<u>Verbal Bullying</u> includes – name calling, profanity or any other activity where a student feels intimidated or disrespected by another student's words.

<u>Physical Bullying</u> includes but is not limited to – spitting, hitting, pinching, pulling hair, pushing, or any activity where a student touches another student in an aggressive manner.

Reports of bullying must be made to the Bus Driver or the Educational Services Director immediately. If a previous incident took place and was not reported it will not be considered after the fact. For example, a parent/student saying "this has been going on for months," but has not been reported will not be considered when dealing with bus suspensions.

If a student is being physically bullied it is important for that student to know that they can protect themselves but not to become aggressive and strike back. If **any** student strikes another student no matter what the circumstances, they will be suspended.

If students are suspended from the buses it is the responsibility of the parents/guardians to ensure that students are transported to school daily. The Millbrook Band will not pay for outside services or provide alternative transportation to transport suspended students. If families do not have access to a vehicle, the Millbrook Band, <u>may</u>, under certain circumstances set up a receivable which will be paid from that parent's Millbrook Treaty Enterprise Credit.



#### 2019 MILLBROOK STUDENT SUMMER EMPLOYMENT PROGRAM

APPLICATION FORMS WILL BE AVAILABLE ON **Monday**, **June 3**<sup>rd</sup>. The following rules and regulations will be strictly adhered to.

The purpose of the Millbrook Summer Employment Program is for students to gain work experience and skill development in various areas of employment.

# Due to the large number of eligible students and fiscal accountability, not all students who apply and are interviewed will be hired.

This is the only Summer Employment Program that will be funded by Millbrook Chief and Council. Eligible students will be Millbrook Band Members who live on the Millbrook Reserves, that are in Grade 10 or above, are over 15 years of age and under 30 years of age, who attended school for the entire school year without being absent for more than 20 school days, and can provide written, confirmed plans to return to school FULL TIME, are eligible to apply. Students who are currently suspended or have been suspended over the school year, or have missed more than 20 school days, are NOT eligible to apply. There will be no exceptions to these rules.

Post secondary students are eligible only if they have had <u>no more than 1 year's</u> <u>disruption</u> in their education and have never held a full time job. Attendance, work ethics while at school and your performance at last year's summer placement will all be factors that are highly considered during the placement process.

Please make sure the **EMAIL** you provide on your application is one you can be reached at. Students will be notified by **EMAIL** of interview times; if you miss your interview another one will not be granted.

All applicants <u>MUST</u> have a Social Insurance Number in order to apply for summer employment. <u>NO EXCEPTIONS</u> can be made.

Summer jobs, including those for university students will be for the seven week period starting on Tuesday, July 3<sup>th</sup> and ending in Friday, August 17<sup>th</sup>. (RECREATION, SPORT AND TINY TOTS CAMPS WILL HAVE TRAINING AND PREP THE WEEK OF JULY 3—6<sup>th</sup>)

Closing Date is be WEDNESDAY, JUNE 20<sup>th</sup>, completed application forms must be returned to the Band Office by 4:00pm, NO EXCEPTIONS.

INTERVIEWS WILL TAKE PLACE BETWEEN JUNE 25—29 (ONCE WE HAVE A DATE WE WILL NOTIFY)





It's better if the client comes to my office and we call the detox to do a booking, the detox "always has to talk to the client first" before a bed is given to them, for the client to answer questions RE: health, and medical. I Can not do the booking for the client. If for some reason client can not make it to my office I ask if they could call them which most of the time it not the same day.


