

Millbrook's Security Services

Millbrook's security team is responsible for keeping Millbrook's community safe and secure. They work around the clock and are on call 24 hours a day. Their duties include patrolling the neighbourhoods of Millbrook and Cole Harbour because having a physical presence in the community is a deterrent for minor damage or other unsavoury activities. They are trained to identify unusual activity and pay attention to detail to reduce risks to the community. In addition, they observe and report suspicious activity that may be criminal.

If a community member is in danger or witnesses criminal activity, it is important that they call 911 or the local Millbrook or Cole Harbour, Sheet Harbour detachment of the RCMP. Please note that the security team cannot report incidents on your behalf.

The Millbrook security team is very focused on prevention and having a constant presence in the community. As you can see from the backgrounders of the team, they have a wide range of experience and training in the security field and community services. In their roles, they must have good communication skills and know how to deal with people in a kind and compassionate manner.

My talented family whom I cherish with all my being consists of my hard-working parents, grandmother, many siblings, nieces, nephews, aunties, uncles and cousins that were instilled at birth with the best sense of humor & values. Born in beautiful Cape Breton and raised by my 70-year-old grandparents, along with aunts and uncles for the first years before being brought to the mainland at the age of four to join my parents and sister in the Millbrook First Nation where I still proudly reside today, my love and passion for community began here. I'm proud to say I've had 3 grandmothers growing up, Kiju, Tiannie & Grandma. Kiju was a Mi'kmaw Matriarch at its finest. She was a medicine woman, prayer leader, midwife & foster mother/grandmother who was one of the most influential figures of my first memories although my strength could've come from my maternal Grandmother Tiannie whom graciously raised all 11 children on her own. Grandma is the only one still alive at 92 years old living the Indigenous Dream. Each grandmother played a major role in my life teaching me about my identity, culture, language & traditions.

My hobbies and enjoyments include time spent with family & friends, visiting, playing cards, laughing, sewing traditional projects and planting my feet into the land especially gardening & gathering medicines.

A graduate from CBU with Bachelor of Arts specializing in Mi'kmaw Studies and Dalhousie University with social work. She has first-hand knowledge of Aboriginal | Indigenous organizations and communities that she has worked for in Atlantic Canada such as Millbrook Band Council, First Nations Inuit Health Branch, Mi'kmaw Legal Support Network, Nova Scotia Native Women's Association, Eastern Door Indigenous Women's Association and Kairos Canada. She is also the President of the Millbrook Women's club and sits on committees including the Mi'kmaw Speakers Bureau, Treaty Education where she finds sharing her culture and language is crucial. Through Treaty Education, she was trained to be a Kairos Blanket Exercise facilitator hosting impactful teachings of the lived life experiences of Indigenous people's atrocities throughout Canadian History. These deep brutally honest exercises capture the audience's emotions with told testimonies of survivors ending it with a talking circle and reminding them to always take themselves in a good way.



Teaching from the Indigenous lens is so important to share with communities and organizations whom want to learn about my people that I am able to share several culturally based teachings celebrating the diversity, strength of our ancestors and the beauty of Canada's Indigenous peoples.

Millbrook Health Centre Update (September 2021)

Due to cleaning protocols and the need to protect all patients and staff at the health centre, anyone with an appointment who has COVID-19 symptoms will be scheduled for an appointment at end of the day (at 4:00 p.m.). We continue to see people in person, but as the delta variant of the COVID-19 virus spreads, additional care needs to be taken. The doctors and nursing staff now require that when you make your appointment that you give your main reason for the appointment to the receptionist. The receptionist will then place you in with the appropriate person at the appropriate time. The receptionist is part of the health care team and is required to maintain confidentiality, and is not asking what your main issue is because they are being nosy. The receptionist also does not need to know every detail of why you need to have an appointment.

Walk-in appointments are not permitted at the Millbrook Health Centre. Please call ahead if you need to see someone and our receptionist will schedule an appointment for you. If you come to the health centre without an appointment, our staff may not have time to see you. Our health centre doors will continue to be locked and you will have to be buzzed in and asked the COVID-19 questionnaire. We ask for your patience going forward and want to assure you that we are doing our best to keep you, the community and our staff safe through this pandemic. Thank you, Millbrook Health Centre

COVID-19 Vaccination – Why It's Important To Be Vaccinated

Evidence shows that individuals who are fully vaccinated (received 2 doses of a COVID-19 mRNA vaccine) and get COVID-19, including the delta variant, are far less likely to develop severe illness that may require hospitalization or result in death.

The risk of severe illness and death from COVID-19 is now greatest among people who are **unvaccinated**. The delta variant of COVID-19 appears to be more contagious, and is causing more severe illness than the previous strains in unvaccinated people.

At this time, children under 12 are still not able to get a COVID-19 vaccine. Getting your 2 doses of the vaccine helps protect children who are unable to be vaccinated at this time.

Having two doses of a COVID-19 vaccine is also required for travel to some places, and the number of places requiring two vaccines will grow going forward (e.g., attendance at some universities, worksites, businesses).

If you have not received the COVID-19 vaccine because you are concerned about its safety, how effective it is, fear of needles, or any other concern, please call the health centre and speak with one of our nurses or doctors who can answer your questions. There is a lot of inaccurate information being shared on social media about the vaccines, and our staff can help clarify some of the confusing information you may have heard or read.

FALL HOME MAINTENANCE

CHECKLIST

INTERIOR

- Ceiling Fans

Changing the direction of your fans for the winter can help circulate heat back down to the rest of your home reducing your home's energy needs and heating cost.

- Smoke and Carbon Monoxide Detectors

Changing the batteries in these could save your life. If the Carbon Monoxide detectors get too cold, they may malfunction and need to be monitored and replaced.

- Chimney

Having your chimney swept every 50-70 burns is ideal. During a cleaning, an inspection for cracks, obstructions, and signs of water damage should be conducted and monitored.

- Furnace

The easiest way to make sure it works all winter long is to change your furnace air filter. Ideally you should change your filter every 3 months.

EXTERIOR

- Roof and Shingles

Any loose or missing shingles can lead to leaks that are hard to fix during the winter. Damage to a roof almost guarantees that damage will occur to the rest of your home.

- Cleaning Gutters

Flushing these with water after removing debris can prevent ice from accumulating and the gutters themselves from needing repairs.

- Siding and Paint

Inspecting for paint that has peeled,

blistered, or cracked can reveal signs that your paint is no longer protecting your home and that is time to reinforce the underlying material.

- Windows and doors

Caulking and sealing any openings will will not only keep water out, but can also help keep heat in. it is estimated that this can help tenants save up to 20% on heating and cooling cost.

- Porch and Deck


