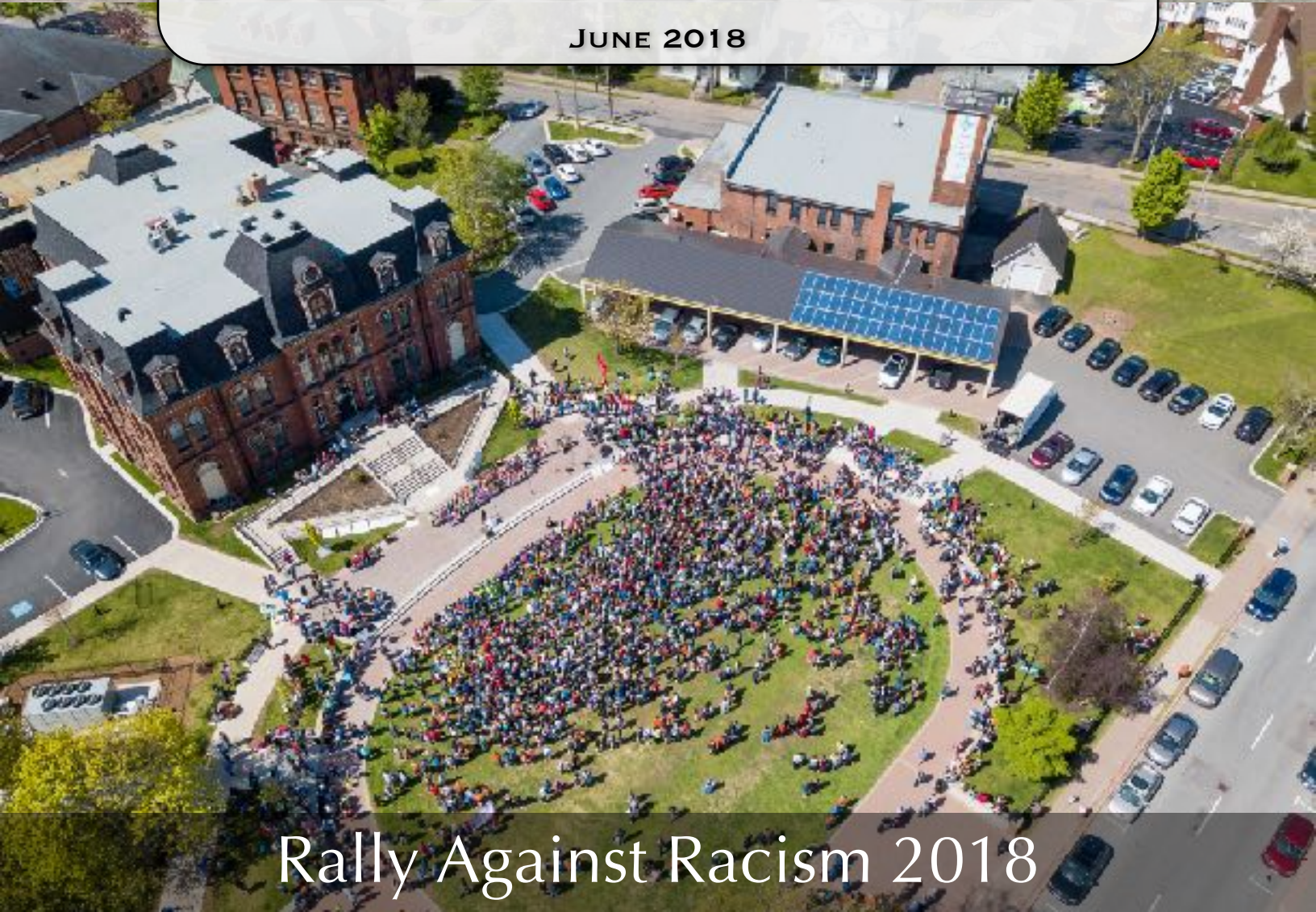

- Do not leave front doors or fence gates open or ajar.
- Do not give the dog access to the screen door, even if it is locked.
- Be careful! Pay attention when you answer the door so the dog does not slip out.

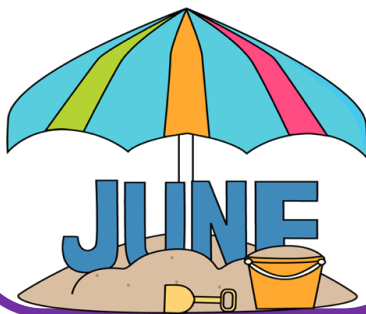

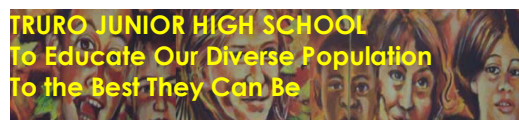

2018 MILLBROOK STUDENT SUMMER EMPLOYMENT PROGRAM

APPLICATION FORMS WILL BE AVAILABLE ON **Monday, June 4th**.

The following rules and regulations will be strictly adhered to.

The purpose of the Millbrook Summer Employment Program is for students to gain work experience and skill development in various areas of employment.

Due to the large number of eligible students and fiscal accountability, not all students who apply and are interviewed will be hired.

This is the only Summer Employment Program that will be funded by Millbrook Chief and Council. Eligible students will be Millbrook Band Members who live on the Millbrook Reserves, that are in Grade 10 or above, are over 15 years of age and under 30 years of age, who attended school **for the entire school year without being absent for more than 20 school days**, and can provide written, confirmed plans to return to school FULL TIME, are eligible to apply. Students who are currently suspended or have been suspended over the school year, or have **missed more than 20 school days, are NOT eligible to apply.** There will be no exceptions to these rules.

Post secondary students are eligible only if they have had **no more than 1 year's disruption** in their education and have never held a full time job. Attendance, work ethics while at school and your performance at last year's summer placement will all be factors that are highly considered during the placement process.

Please make sure the **EMAIL** you provide on your application is one you can be reached at. Students will be notified by **EMAIL** of interview times; if you miss your interview another one will not be granted.

All applicants **MUST** have a Social Insurance Number in order to apply for summer employment. **NO EXCEPTIONS** can be made.

Summer jobs, including those for university students will be for the seven week period starting in Tuesday, July 3th and ending in Friday, August 17th.
(RECREATION, SPORT AND TINY TOTS CAMPS WILL HAVE TRAINING AND PREP THE WEEK OF JULY 3 – 6th)

Closing Date is be WEDNESDAY, JUNE 20th, completed application forms must be returned to the Band Office by 4:00pm, NO EXCEPTIONS.

INTERVIEWS WILL TAKE PLACE BETWEEN JUNE 25 – 29
(ONCE WE HAVE A DATE WE WILL NOTIFY)

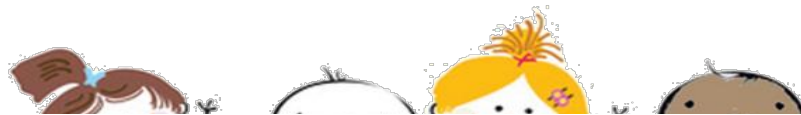

Millbrook Health Fair 2018

May 17, 2018

Millbrook's Annual Health Fair at the Millbrook Gymnasium is a community information session with local Health Care Specialists. Community member Valerie Julian-Meader has been organizing the Health Fair since 1998. It has grown over the years to include various local businesses and partners. This year's event hosted 37 vendors spread amongst 32 tables! Attendees were treated to tea, coffee, sweets and a barbeque lunch provided by the wellness program, as well as a variety of knick knacks and information from different vendors. As in previous years there was registration for vendors and participants for prizes donated generously by the vendors and local businesses the grand prize this year was a barbeque which was donated by Wellness program!



"We have a lot of resources here and people get to see a face and see who is there, and what's available." Said Valerie some of the vendors who participated were, Non-Insured Health Benefits, Canadian Cancer Society, Crime Stoppers, Sleep Therapeutics, Confederacy of Mainland Mi'kmaq, Mi'kmaq Conservation group. Non-Insured Health Benefits was present this year and were able to help attendees understand what is covered under Non-Insured Health Benefits, "Which is great because a lot of people call the Health Centre wondering what is covered and what is not" says Carla Moore, Director of Health Services. Valerie enjoys seeing the vendors interacting, informing and helping our community members. Most notably, one individual had a disabled child who was having difficulty at home with no where to turn. Valerie introduced them to the Disability Support Program, who was able to provide at home services! This year the fair boasted a total of 235 people! Various Health Centre staff participated, including Nurses, Suzette and Cindy to check blood pressure for attendees while CMM's Diabetes Worker was checking



attendee blood sugar levels. Since it's inception this year was one of the biggest Health Fairs, usually a max of 35 vendors are allowed to attend, that's just the organization themselves, if they bring 4 or 5 people in their group it makes for great exposure! The Health Fair also provides an opportunity for organizations to network between each other, giving them a chance to work towards the greater good of the community Carla Moore, Director of Health Services said "They've been having the Health Fair for years, and it gets very good participation from the community and also from the vendors. Every year Val has to turn people away because we have more people wanting to be involved then our current space can accommodate." Valerie hopes as the Health Fair continues to grow it could be moved to a larger location, which would alleviate having to turn people away who want to share information with our community.

Its better if the client comes to my office and we call the detox to do a booking, the detox “always has to talk to the client first” before a bed is given to them, for the client to answer questions RE : health, and medical. I Can not do the booking for the client. If for some reason client can not make it to my office I ask if they could call them which most of the time it not the same day.

[Health services:](#)

Please call NIHB before you get eye exams/glasses, medical transportation, medications and mental health services to see if those are covered by NIHB and that you are eligible for those things. The NIHB toll-free number is 1-800-565-3294 (press 2 for client, then press 1 for vision, 2 for medical transportation, 3 for medical supplies and equipment, 4 for medications, or 5 for mental health). Before you undergo a dental procedure, make sure your dentist has called NIHB’s dental pre-determination centre to find out if the procedure is covered by NIHB.

[We have been advised that chemical substances that are related to fentanyl have been found in street drug samples in both NS and PEI.](#)

While this is the first time fentanyl has been found in street drugs in NS and PEI, it is not entirely unexpected. In June 2017, police confirmed the presence of a potent narcotic, carfentanil in a drug seizure in NS.

Therefore, there is an increased risk to anyone who uses street drugs – not just opioids – in pill or powdered form.

- If you use street drugs, it’s important to do so safely. Don’t use alone. Always carry naloxone.
- If you witness an overdose, call 911. If you have naloxone, 911 responders can walk you through how to administer a dose while you wait for paramedics to arrive.
- Do not hesitate to call 911 in the event of an overdose emergency. The federal government has recently passed Good Samaritan legislation to protect bystanders from criminal prosecution when calling for help in this situation.

ISAP Indigenous Student Access Pathway

ISAP

The Indigenous Student Access Pathway is designed and delivered as a one-year program exclusively for First Nations, Métis and Inuit students who would not otherwise be eligible for admissions under Dalhousie's current minimum high school prerequisites, and who would benefit from dedicated supports while transitioning to a university environment.

ACADEMIA AND CULTURE

The ISAP will engage Indigenous students both academically and culturally. Throughout the student experience there will be opportunities for community involvement, access to Dalhousie's Elders in Residence program, and more. By immersing the students in a strong and supportive network of faculty, staff, and peers, the ISAP aims to provide both the tools for navigating post-secondary, and a culturally supportive environment needed to succeed.

PROGRAM DATES

ISAP runs from September to the end of April. Upon completion, successful ISAP students have the option to apply for enrollment in following term.

COURSE LOAD

ISAP students will be registered in four courses (3 credit and 1 non-credit) in both the Fall and Winter terms. Upon successful completion of ISAP, each student will have earned between 18 - 24 credits that will be transferable to other degree programs.

SUPPORTS AND SERVICES

The ISAP students will have access to the campus Manager of Indigenous Students and be provided a variety of support services and opportunities within the program.

STUDENT ELIGIBILITY

In order to be considered for admission to the ISAP, applicants must meet the following minimum criteria:

- Provide proof of Aboriginal Ancestry. *
- Present valid high school diploma

* The Constitution Act, 1982 specifies that the Aboriginal peoples in Canada consist of three groups: First Nations, Inuit, and Métis people.

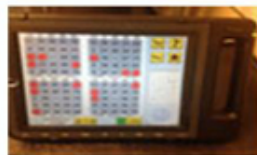
