Currently poised to enter architectural design for the future building at the Debert and Belmont archaeological sites, the Centre is a major initiative. Working from the existing communications strategy, the Communications Officer will play a central role in engaging Mi'kmaw communities, communicating to present funders, working with the Fund Development Officer and sustaining public communication initiatives including the MDCC website, newsletter and related communications materials.

#### **Duties of the Communications Officer include:**

- Raising the profile and awareness of the MDCC with Mi'kmaw communities, key stakeholders, primary funders, and the general public;
- Implementing, with revisions as necessary, the existing the MDCC communications strategy;
- Cultivating and creating positive media stories;
- Producing print, web, periodical, site-specific advertising, and signage;
- Managing and growing the MDCC website;
- Attending public speaking events and trade shows;
- Collaborating and supporting activities of the Fund Development Officer;
- Supporting project staff and management with strategic partnerships;
- Other communication duties as identified by the Director of History and Culture.

Denny, Co-Emcee Saqamaw Leroy Denny, Head Female Dancer Willow Abrahamson, Head Male Dancer Levi Blackwolf, the Host Drum The Boyz - TBZ, all the dancers and all the drum groups. # Head Male Dancer for the 2019 Millbrook Competition Powwow:

Levi BlackWolf (Warm Springs/Yakama) is a citizen of the Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs, Oregon. He is a father, traditional and contemporary artist, dancer, and horseman and spends a majority of his time traveling throughout Indian Country. As a traditional artist, he beads, sews, and works with quills, shells and leather and is an old style horsetail and slick style round bustle dancer seen frequently on the powwow trail. His traditional creations and dancing connect him with his Columbia River Plateau roots including his ancestor's long history of horsemanship. As a contemporary visual artist, he works through the mediums of photography, videography, graphic design and screenwriting and is known for his ability to integrate traditional imagery with contemporary graphic design. His artistic mediums have provided a way for him to express his creative talents, honor the artistic traditions of his people, and document Indigenous culture for future generations.

We're excited to have Levi joining us this year as an honoured guest to our powwow and look forward to witnessing his unique style of dance, wela'lioq

#### 2019 Millbrook Powwow Head Lady:

Willow Rose Abrahamson "Buh'ha Wiyipuh" is an internationally recognized champion jingle dance, model and cultural presenter. She is Lemhi Shoshone Bannock (Agai-duka Salmon Eater Band) with Colville Confederated (Wenatchi and Moses Band), Coeur D'Alene and Spokane tribal blood in her bloodlines. Willow is extremely honored to be selected Head Lady of the 21th annual Millbrook First Nation's Competition Powwow.

Buhnuh, I am very excited about being in the eastern corridor of this continent in Nova Scotia, Canada to experience and share my dance and culture with the Mi'kmaq Nation. Alongside my Warm Springs brother Levi, I will be dancing to honor the people, encourage the youth, and to enjoy the spirit of our songs and dances. I am also looking forward to seeing the culture and hearing the language of the Mi'kmaq peoples. I have traveled to many powwows throughout North America, but it will be my first time in Nova Scotia. I look forward to this experience. Oose.

# INSTRUCTIONS FOR BUS PASSENGERS



The driver is in full charge of the school bus. Obey his instructions.

Be on time - the bus will not wait.

NO BULLYING OF ANY KIND WHILE ON THE BUS.

Do not talk to the driver unless necessary.

Do not swear or use bad language while on the bus.

Do not talk loudly, yell or whistle while on the bus.

Do not stand or move about while the bus is moving.

Do not open the windows without permission.

Do not put hands, arms, feet or head out the bus window.

Do not throw anything inside the bus or out the windows.

Keep aisles of the bus clear at all times.

When it is necessary to cross the bus in front of the bus, walk 10 feet in front of the bus so the driver can see you, cross to the center of the street, STOP, LOOK and LISTEN and cross the street when it is safe to do so. Never stand or play on the road while waiting for the bus.


Thank you to CMM/green team, Leana & Shane Kennedy for providing us with our compost buckets for our "compost bucket challenge."

#### **Public Notice**

August 16, 2019

There have been many concerns voiced about the sudden appearance of at least nine persons or businesses selling cannabis on Millbrook Band Lands. Many of you have contacted various members of Council and the Band Administration to express concern for the safety and well-being of community members. We share these concerns too.

Under the existing Canadian law, each province is responsible for the licensing of the retail sale of cannabis, while the federal government is responsible for the licensing of growers. To the best of our knowledge, there are no provincially licensed sellers of cannabis in our community.

Some of these sellers will suggest they have a Treaty or an aboriginal right to sell cannabis, however, the legal merit of such arguments are unproven and risky. Aboriginal rights are held collectively, not by individuals. Certainly, challenging laws based on arguments about what our Treaty rights permit us to do has worked for the Mi'kmaq in the past. However, putting our Treaties before the courts in this way places them at risk of being undermined to the detriment of the Mi'kmaq as a whole. It is not a matter to be undertaken lightly.

The Millbrook Chief and Council are exploring the development of a regulatory framework for the access to cannabis industry in Millbrook. While we remain confident a regulatory system that our community can embrace will be established, this will take time, given the need to first engage the community and the complicated interplay between the federal and provincial laws and our own jurisdiction.

We want to assure you that in the coming months, our priority will be the health, safety, security and good reputation of our community. These are unique challenges that we face and we ask that people remain patient during this time.

#### **Moose Harvester Checkpoints**

As Mi'kmaq, we have an inherent right to access and use our resources. We also have a responsibility to the environment, and the plants and animals that live within it.

In our long held tradition of Netukulimk, we have always balanced community nutrition with the integrity of our environment. Today, you have an important role in helping us to protect and better understand the Cape Breton moose population.

Mi'kmaq harvesters have been requesting checkpoints in the Cape Breton Highlands and we have listened and taken this request very seriously.

Starting this year, checkpoint stations will be set up at Hunter's Mountain and Wreck Cove and will be there throughout the harvesting season, operated by both Mi'kmaq and Lands & Forestry representatives.

Stopping at these checkpoints is voluntary, but we are asking Mi'kmaq harvesters to help us preserve, protect and understand this very important species. If you are successful in this year's harvest, please stop into one of our checkpoints.

At these check stations, we will be collecting lower jaw bones, female reproductive tracts, and antler measurements to help us all better understand the health of the moose population. We are also asking for heart, lungs, liver, head and scat samples. A brochure on how to collect these samples will be given out at the 2019 Mi'kmaw Summer Games, can be found on the Assembly, UINR or KMKNO's Facebook pages, and/or are available at the check point stations.

Each person who drops off the lower jawbone and either the female reproductive tracts, or antler measurements, along with a completed survey will be entered into a draw for one of three prizes:

- Cabela's Ultimate Alaknak Tent;
- Ascend CD14 Canoe with paddles and life jackets; or
- Reconyx HyperFire2<sup>TM</sup> High-Output Trail Camera.

The draw will take place at the Annual Feast in the Highlands in October.

We thank you for your involvement and helping us to ensure that the moose population stays healthy for years to come.

The NIHB toll-free number is 1-800-565-3294 (press 2 for client, then press 1 for vision, 2 for medical transportation, 3 for medical supplies and equipment, 4 for medications, or 5 for mental health). Before you undergo a dental procedure, make sure your dentist has called NIHB's dental pre-determination centre to find out if the procedure is covered by NIHB.

#### Capital Assets Millbrook Band Council June 5, 2019

- 1. The Millbrook Band will replace capital assets that came with the original house for CMHC homes and other Band owned and controlled homes.
- 2. Capital asset items will only be replaced when they are no longer performing or operating as originally intended, has achieved/reached their generally accepted useful life and any further repair or maintenance work will not ensure continued reasonable performance or operation.
- 3. All capital asset items will only be replaced after inspection/recommendations from Millbrook Construction Supervisors or designates.
- 4. The following items are considered capital assets:
  - Roofs, including coating and flashing
  - Exterior doors and windows
  - Heating systems, including boilers (hot water or steam), forced air furnaces, chimneys and related components, heat pumps
  - Domestic hot water tanks, septic tanks, and tile beds (fittings and controls replaced during the course of regular routine maintenance are not eligible)
  - Stove and refrigerators
  - Toilets and tubs
  - Smoke detectors
- 5. The following items must be pre-approved by Band inspectors:
  - Replacing foundations or significant portions of foundations
  - other structural components such as wall, floor and roof framing
  - Plumbing systems
  - Electrical installations including project transformers
- 6. If the homeowner does not pay rent they do not qualify to this policy except for the roof, chimney, venmar, heat pump, water and sewer.
